Ayer was nominated not just because of the great work he does on duty but for something he did on the way to work. L. Ayer came upon a horrific traffic collision involving a rental moving truck. He immediately pulled over and climbed over the crushed hood, crawled through the broken windshield and assessed the driver and passenger for injuries. He called 911 and advise the dispatcher to send a Lifeline helicopter. The young boy's arm was impaled with glass from the side window. He has a potential of bleeding to death if not property removed. Both the passenger and the driver survived due in large part to Lt. Ayer's quick actions land selfless service.


