The Walmart Neighborhood Market concept is a chain of grocery stores launched by Walmart in 1998. The stores are designed to be the opposite of vastly larger superstores. These smaller stores are meant to attract shoppers with easier parking, less crowded aisles and quicker checkout. Walmart Neighborhood Market stores offer a variety of products including a full line of groceries. Stores range around 40,000 square feet, which is a quarter of the size of a typical Walmart Supercenter The Walmart Neighborhood Markets employ 80–100 employees and offer about 28,000 items.

As of 2008, the Walmart Neighborhood Market chain has expanded into many smaller Southern markets in the United States. Those in Harker Heights are the beneficiaries of this new store in their neighborhood. The store in Harker Heights also sells gasoline.
