

Dick Young Assumes role of Club President

At a special called meeting of the Exchange Club of Killeen Board of Directors on August 6, 2015, President Charlie Guidry advised that he would be stepping down as President and assuming his role as Immediate Past President. The position of President can be filled with any Past President of the club. He also advised that Barbara West had resigned from the Board of Directors and from the club. President advised that her resignation is effective when received by the President. He stated that her position can be filled by appointment. President position – National Exchange Club strongly recommends that a former President be appointed giving the current President-Elect the opportunity to serve out his full year as President-Elect.

Article 6, Paragraph B3

Should it be determined that the President's absence, inability or refusal to perform some or all of their duties is not temporary, and the President-Elect advises the Board of Directors that they are unable or unwilling to assume those duties and responsibilities at the time, then the Board of Directors by a majority



vote shall appoint an Interim President from the Past Presidents to complete the remainder of the unexpired term. The Immediate Past President may be selected.

Dick Young was elected by majority of the members of the Board of Directors to serve as our President 2015-2016. Larry Holly was elected to fill Barbara West's seat on the Board of Directors.

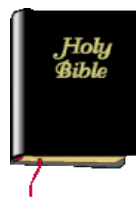
