### NATIONAL SERVICE AWARD GOALS REACHED IN EARLY JULY

Several club members participated in a marathon service day on the first week of July to help the club garner the National Service Award for the club. President Charlie Guidry was on hand at several of the activities.

#### **CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION:**

We placed Child Abuse Prevention Brochures at Bell County Human Services HELP Center, we gave Time Out Teddy Brochures to our area Head Start and a Time Out Teddy plush stuffed animal for their annual Teacher's In-Service for 140 Head Start Teachers. We also took 500 Blue Ribbon pins to the Greater Killeen Chamber of Commerce for inclusion in the New Teacher Orientation packets.

AMERICANISM: We gave kids who were participating in the morning and in the afternoon Killeen Public Library Summer Reading Program flags for

Independence Day Celebrations. We also presented 144 flags to the Child Development Center for their annual Day of the Child parade.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: We helped put training manuals together and put labels on local area meeting brochures for Bring Everyone In The Zone. We delivered cases of copy paper to our Local USO Fort Hood.

YOUTH: We gave Skiddles Candy to the Killeen Public Library in the morning and the afternoon Summer Reading Program. Volunteers stayed to help read to the children.

FUND RAISING: We received donations from members to cover the cost of the paper we gave to the USO Fort Hood and also received donations for our National Day of Service and our Child Abuse Prevention Projects from the members of the club through a voluntary contribution. We held a 50/50 raffle and raised \$38.
