worldwide campus enrollment includes Classroom Enrollments of 105,415, Distance Learning enrollments of 62,420 and the **Texas Campuses Enrollment** includes 70,682 and Distance Learning enrollments of 43,182. Additionally there are 1,043 students in KISD and CCISD receiving dual credit enrollment. This enables these students to leave high school with their Associate Degree in many cases.
